CHAPTER-1

THE PUNJAB JUDICIAL ACADEMY

Introduction:

The Punjab Judicial Academy (PJA) is a statutory body established under the Punjab Judicial Academy Act, 2007. Its purpose is to provide training to judicial officers and court personnel in Punjab, aiming to enhance their skills, professional competence, and ethical standards for the efficient dispensation of justice. Initially, the PJA is located in a building of the Lahore High Court at 15-Fane Road, Lahore. However, a new campus for PJA is currently under construction near Kala Shah Kaku on piece of land measuring 393 Kanal. The new campus will include Administrative & Academic Blocks, Male and Female Hostels, Community Centre and residences for the employees. It is expected to be completed near soon.

PJA provides a range of training programs for judicial officers and court personnel. These programs cover induction training for newly recruited judicial officers, refresher training for those currently serving, and specialized training on different legal topics. The PJA expresses confidence that these training initiatives will contribute to enhancing the quality of justice in Punjab.

Additionally, the Academy organizes conferences, seminars, and workshops addressing the legal and judicial issues. These events serve as platforms for judicial officers and court personnel to share their experiences and learn from one another.



Aims & Objectives of PJA:

Aims & Objectives of PJA as follows: -

- Provide comprehensive training to judicial officers and court personnel on a wide range of legal topics, including the law of evidence, criminal law, civil law and procedural law.
- Enhance the skills and knowledge of judicial officers and court personnel in areas such as legal research, legal writing and advocacy, ensuring they are well-equipped to perform their duties effectively.
- Promote and facilitate the adoption of modern technology and innovative practices in the administration of justice, thereby streamlining court processes and improving efficiency.
- Sensitize all stakeholders within the justice system to various forms of biases and discrimination.

The PJA is fully committed to realizing its vision and mission through a variety of training programs, conferences, and workshops. These initiatives are expected to contribute significantly to enhancing the overall quality of justice delivery in Punjab.

Vision:

The vision of PJA is to become a Center of Excellence for Judicial Education, dedicated to enhancing the capacity, competency, and professional efficiency of Judicial Officers and Court Staff.

Mission:

The mission of PJA is to standardize and elevate the level of knowledge, skills, and attitudes of Judicial Officers fulfilling their responsibilities in the province of Punjab. This will be achieved through the effective utilization of legal instruments, modern technology/ E-learning and a strict adherence to the verdicts pronounced by the Superior Courts of the Country.



Functions of PJA:

The Punjab Judicial Academy has the following functions: -

- a) Impart pre-service and in-service training to the judicial officers and court personnel;
- b) Develop the skills and techniques for court management, case management, delay reduction, alternate dispute resolution and judgment writing;
- c) develop training courses relating to administration of justice including use of information technology;
- d) Organize conferences, seminars, lectures, workshops and symposia relating to court management, administration of justice, and legislative drafting;
- e) Publish books, journals, research papers and reports on important topics relating to administration of justice;
- f) Promote research on case management and court management;
- g) Encourage legal and constitutional research;
- h) Inculcate and promote ethical values and standards in judicial officers and court personnel;
- i) Coordinate with other educational and training institutions including the Federal Judicial Academy; and
- j) Perform such other functions as may be assigned to it by the Board.

PJA offers training to the judicial officers and court personnel using modern techniques, including webinars sessions. The Academy also conducts research and training programs to enhance the skills and knowledge of judges for the implementation of new laws. The objective of the Academy is to provide ongoing judicial education based on research, aiming to improve the competency and professionalism of key players in the justice sector.



Core Values of PJA:

The core values of PJA are:-

(i) Integrity and decorum:

The PJA emphasizes the importance of integrity and decorum because these qualities are essential for ensuring a fair and just administration of justice. When judicial officers and court personnel are honest, it inspires confidence in the justice system.

(ii) Honesty and fairness:

PJA believes judges and court staff should be honest and fair because it makes the justice system fair for everyone. When judges and court staff are honest and fair, people can trust the justice system more.

(iii) Respect and kindness:

Respect and kindness are essential for ensuring a fair administration of justice. When judicial officers and court personnel treat everyone with respect and kindness, it makes the justice system more accessible to everyone.

(iv) Teamwork and devotion:

The PJA emphasizes the importance of teamwork and devotion, when judicial officers and court personnel work together as a team and are dedicated to their work, it makes the justice system more efficient and effective.

(v) Competence and professional excellence:

PJA emphasizes continuous improvement for judicial officers and court personnel to provide excellent service through ongoing learning and dedication.



(vi) Transparency and accountability:

PJA promotes transparency and accountability among judicial officers and court personnel, emphasizing honesty to public scrutiny and a willingness to explain decisions.

Board of Management:

The Management and Administration of the Punjab Judicial Academy is entrusted to the Board of Management (BoM). The BoM is led by the Hon'ble Chief Justice, Lahore High Court as Chairperson. The Board of Management comprises of the following members: -

(i)	Chief Justice, Lahore High Court	Chairperson

Section 8 of the Punjab Judicial Academy Act, 2007 prescribes the functions of the Board. The Board exercise supervisory and administrative control over all affairs of the Punajb Judicial Academy. The Board:

- Lays down the policy and program for training and approves courses of the Academy.
- Evaluates the performance of the Academy.
- Approves the annual budget and revised budget estimates of the Academy.
- Causes proper books of accounts to be maintained for all sums of money received and expenditures incurred by the Academy and arranges for the audit of accounts.
- Determines the terms and conditions of service of the Director General and staff of the Academy.
- Creates, abolishes, or upgrades a post.
- Appoints an officer in BS-16 or above.
- Prescribes qualifications, conditions of service, and other matters relating to faculty, officers, and staff.

The Board may also purchase, acquire, hire, dispose of or construct any property for the Academy; hold, control and administer the property of the Academy; receive grants-in-aid and donations from the Federal Government, the Punjab Government or any other organization, person or agency; regulate, determine and administer all matters concerning the Academy; appoint advisors, consultants and experts for assistance; appoint or hire permanent or visiting faculty; assign a specific power to a person or organization and exercise any other power ancillary to the aims and objects of the Academy.

CHAPTER-2

PJA'S COLLABORATION WITH OTHER INSTITUTIONS

This training equips judges to address contemporary challenges and deliver effective justice. The collaborative platform facilitates the exchange of invaluable information, including innovative techniques and methodologies, for imparting legal education across all levels of the justice sector.

The PJA not only conducts training but also drives research programs to improve law implementation. Actively collaborating with global institutions and experts, it ensures our legal system stays informed of the latest developments, enhancing the overall justice sector.

CHAPTER-3

PJA ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

(July, 2022 to June, 2023)

During the reporting period from July, 2022 to June, 2023, the Punjab Judicial Academy organized various training programs for judges and court personnel. These programs were categorized into two types: (i) Pre-service training and (ii) In-service training.

- Pre-service training is designed for newly appointed Additional (i) District & Session Judges and Civil Judges. It covers a wide range of including substantive and procedural topics, laws, court administration, case management and judicial code of conduct and ethics. The program also incorporates personal well-being grooming sessions and organized study visits to various departments including Punjab Forensic Science Agency (PFSA), DNA Lab of King Edward Medical University (KEMU), Punjab Institute of Mental Health (PIMH) and Sessions Court.
- (ii) **In-service training** caters to judges and court personnel currently in service, aiming to enhance their skills and knowledge. This training program includes various training courses, comprising the General Training Program (GTP), Performance Evaluation Training Program and refresher training courses. Topics covered in Inservice training include updates on new laws and amendments, case management, and judicial ethics. Furthermore, the program addresses specific skills such as mediation and alternative dispute resolution.



PJA also provides trainings to court personnel, including Staff Officers, Stenographers, Clerks, Bailiffs and Naib Qasids. These specialized programs cover essential topics court procedures, record-keeping practices, and customer service skills. By addressing the specific needs of diverse court personnel, the training aims to enhance their proficiency and contribute to the overall efficiency of the judicial system.

The Academic Wing of PJA designs the curricula, addressing both core and non-core issues such as Administration of Justice, Information Technology usage, Research Techniques, Mock Trials and skills development for Court and Case Management, Delay Reduction, Alternate Dispute Resolution and Judgment Writing. This Wing is responsible for creating comprehensive reading materials for participant in various training programs, all of which are accessible on the PJA website.

The Academic Wing conducts pre and post-training assessments to gauge participants' capacities at the beginning and measure improvements after the training. Furthermore, it actively promotes academic activities at the Punjab Judicial Academy through the organization of seminars, workshops, national and international conferences and panel discussions.

Detailed PJA Academic Activities

(July, 2022 - June, 2023)

1. General Training Programs for AD&SJs and Civil Judges

The Punjab Judicial Academy has consistently organized training programs to refresh the knowledge of criminal and civil law, aiming to enhance the competence of Judges and Court Personnel. The General Training Program (GTP) is a regular feature of the training activities. PJA started GTP in 2015 with the objectives to train all the judges in Punjab every year to refresh their legal knowledge and to equip them with latest case law developed by the superior courts of the Country in order to improve competence, judicial ethics and fair administration of justice.

In the calendar year 2019-2020, a 6-day General Training Program was initiated for Additional District & Session Judges and Civil Judges focusing on the following objectives:

- To refresh participants' knowledge of civil and criminal laws.
- To assess the current competence level of participants, analysing their potential for future assignments.
- To enhance and sharpen judgment-writing skills.
- To improve effective decision-making power.
- To provide orientation and equip participants for new assignments as Additional District & Sessions Judges and Civil Judges.
- To address shortcomings in decision-making that may arise during judicial proceedings and equip judges with enhanced judgmentwriting skills.
- To focus on improving the judicial conduct of participants, reflecting in the day-to-day dispensation of justice.

Some batches of GTP (2019-20) for AD&SJs and Civil Judges were conducted in that year. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, GTP-



2019-20 was temporarily suspended. On the direction of the Hon'ble Chairperson BoM, PJA, the remaining batches of GTP 2019-2020 for Additional District & Sessions Judges and Civil Judges were rescheduled and successfully organized during this year.

For the **academic year 2022-23**, the Punjab Judicial Academy has designed a new 6-day GTP for all the Additional District & Sessions Judges and Civil Judges of Punjab to address their in-service training needs. The GTP (2022-23) aims to overcome shortcomings in decision making that have surfaced in judicial proceedings. Its primary focus is to enable judges to enhance their **Judgment Writing Skills** for the fair administration of judicial system. Additionally, the program targets the improvement of the self-learning capacity of judicial officers by developing their research skill and enhancing their decision making power. The topics of GTP (2022-23) for AD&SJs and Civil Judges are:-

- Judgement Writing (Sequence & Structure) Civil Case Appraisal of Evidence thereof.
- Judgment Writing (Sequence & Structure) Criminal Case
- Judgment Writing (Civil & Criminal) Practical Assignments
- Judgement Writing (Sequence & Structure) Murder Trial Case Appraisal of Evidence thereof.
- Guidelines for Judgement Writing-Murder Trial Cases.
- Use of precedents in judgment writing, how to find ratio decidendi and obitor dicta.
- Guidelines for Judgement Writing-Civil & Criminal Cases.

1.1. GTP for AD&SJs

The remaining three batches (18, 19, and 19-A) of GTP 2019-20 and six batches of GTP (2022-23) for Additional District & Sessions Judges were conducted throughout the reporting year. Additionally, four batches of GTP, specifically designed for newly promoted Additional




District & Sessions Judges, were also conducted during this year. The purpose was to enhance their skills, competence, and develop judicial conduct.

During the 2nd week of the training, participants were attached to the Research Center of Lahore High Court, Lahore for Legal Research Training. The Research Officers of Lahore High Court sensitized them about advanced legal research methodology, including tools and techniques. They were briefed that legal research has become much easier and quicker with the use of Information Technology as compared to the traditional methods of manually searching books and material. They were also briefed that there are hundreds of websites and search



engines which can be utilized for the purposes of finding appropriate legal precedents, articles, books and references online. The participants were sensitized that utilization of information technology tools can improve the quality of any legal writing including judgments, law books, legal articles and research papers.

Study Visit:

On 2nd August, 2022, PJA organized a study visit to King Edward Medical University Lahore, specifically to the Department of Forensic Medicine for the participants (26 newly promoted AD&SJs) Batch-III. The supervision of the visit was conducted by the Director Academics of PJA.

Upon arrival, the delegation, led by the learned Director Academics, was welcomed by Dr. Fariha Tariq, the Head of the Department of Forensic Medicine. Following a brief introduction, the delegation was guided through the entire process of receiving and registering deceased individuals, their preservation in cold storage, the transfer to the autopsy room with associated police documentation, and the procedures for postmortem examinations. During the visit, participants had the opportunity



to explore various laboratories, the museum, and the lecture theatre of the Forensic Medicine Department at King Edward Medical University.

Court Attachment:

The Punjab Judicial Academy organized a two-day Court Attachment for newly promoted Additional District & Sessions Judges (AD&SJs) with the District and Sessions Courts in Lahore. The primary aim was to provide these participants with practical knowledge of working in civil and criminal courts.

During attachment the trainees were attached with the senior and experienced judges of district judiciary working on criminal and civil sides where they observed the working of the civil & criminal courts and practically went through different aspects of the judicial working, i.e. court appearance, hearing of arguments on misc. application, dictating orders thereon, writing interim orders, framing of issues in civil cases, framing of charge in criminal cases, recording of evidence in criminal cases, hearing of final arguments and pronouncement of judgments etc.


Mock Trials:

speaking, practical applications of legal principles, and boosts their confidence in understanding how criminal justice works.



CHAPTER-4

WEBINARS

E-Learning is a method of learning that utilizes modern technologies to access educational curriculum beyond traditional classrooms. The Punjab Judicial Academy has introduced e-learning programs through Webinars. One outstanding initiative of the PJA is the launch of distance learning, Online Training Programs for all judges in Punjab. It is anticipated that this program will revolutionize the training methodology due to its time-saving and cost-effective nature.

A webinar is a type of seminar conducted over the internet, allowing participants in different locations to see and hear the presenter, ask questions, and discuss issues for resolution. The Punjab Judicial Academy aims to achieve its objectives, as outlined in section 4(d) of The Punjab Judicial Academy Act, 2007, by developing training courses related to the administration of justice using information technology. The Academy has conducted various webinars online during this reporting year for members of the district judiciary.

1. Webinar Sessions on the topic "Legal, Moral and Ethical Rights of Children/Minors"

The Punjab Judicial Academy arranged a Distance Learning Training Program through Webinars for the Judges of Guardian Courts, Family Courts, Special Courts, Additional District & Sessions Judge in every district notified to deal with cases of Child Protection Laws, Child Protection Courts as well as District Appellate Courts of Punjab on the topic "Legal, Moral and Ethical Rights of Children/Minors" to



sensitize them about the importance of minors' rights to be protected through the judicial proceedings.

The objectives of this training program are to:

- Develop skills and techniques of Judges in Guardian Courts, Family Courts, Special Courts.
- Focus on the training of one Additional District & Sessions Judge in each district handling Child Protection Laws cases.
- Extend training to Judges working in Child Protection Courts and District Appellate Courts in Punjab.
- Improve the quality of decision-making and increase the efficiency of case disposal by enhancing the competence of judges.

Mr. Ashtar Abbas, Acting Director General, PJA, addressed the participants and expressed his views and objectives of the training programme and sensitized them about the importance of minors' rights. He further stated that minor/children are future of the nation and to protect their rights is the foremost duty of the court.

Four webinar sessions on the topics related to child welfare were conducted in previous academic year 2021-2022 (April to June, 2022) and remaining webinar sessions were conducted during this academic year (2022-2023), as follows:

2. Webinar Sessions on "Core and Non-Core Topics" for all Judges during Summer Vacations



Maintenance of relevant record" on 25th August, 2022, respectively.






- To enhance the capacity of court staff to improve their overall performance.




5. Online Training via Webinar for deputed staff of Courts on the topic "Implementation of Record Room Management System"







ADR also permits parties to come up with more creative solutions that a court may not be legally allowed to impose.



Each webinar session was followed by question and answer segment, during which participants actively engaged. They attempted to address issues related to referral to ADR centers. Participants expressed their appreciation for the efforts of PJA in conducting the online training program on ADR.


training program and elaborated on its objectives. The participants were then imparted training on the following Non-Core topics:




(ii) Punjab Judicial Academy Law Journal (PJALJ)



aims to provide an orientation and synopsis of the subject.




(iv) Handbook on Latest Amendments in the Control of Narcotics Substance Act, 1997


