One Week Training Program-2024 for Judicial Officers on Revenue Documents Analysis and Inheritance Issues.

he Punjab Judicial Academy is committed to enhance the capacity and professional competence of judicial officers and court personnel through various training programs. Analysis and admissibility of the revenue documents is normally considered as most crucial issue in every civil litigation, especially in declaratory suits and suits relating to inheritance matters, thus it is generally perceived that reading and understanding revenue documents in true perspective has been a grey area in the trial courts since long.

The Hon'ble Chairperson, Board of Management, PJA while realizing the problems and issues faced by the judges of district judiciary in analysing the revenue documents in civil litigation, directed the Academy to design a curriculum on this crucial issue. Pursuant to the kind directions of Hon'ble Chairperson, Board of Management, the PJA introduced a training program for proper understanding of revenue documents for the judicial officers along with technicalities and modalities involved in the Law of Inheritance. To achieve and accomplish this task befittingly some senior former revenue officers well conversant with the revenue documents were invited to deliver lectures to the judges. Mr. Shahbaz Ahmad, Additional District & Sessions Judge, Fortabbas having special expertise in law of inheritance also delivered lectures to the participants on the topic of "Law of Inheritance".



During the current quarter six (06) batches on "Revenue Document Analysis and Inheritance Issues", were conducted from 07.04.2025 to 28.06.2025.





Upon successful completion of each training batch, the concluding ceremony of each training batch was chaired by Hon'ble Mr. Justice (Rtd) Sardar Ahmed Naeem, Director General Punjab Judicial Academy. The ceremony started with the recitation of verses from the Holy Quran. Thereafter, a representative of trainee judges from each batch shared his/her views and feedback on behalf of their batch-mates, appreciating the new training module of analysis of revenue documents and the efforts of the resource persons to inculcate practical knowledge of these documents in interactive sessions.







One Week Training Program-2024 for Judicial Officers on Forensic Insight: Enhancing Judicial Outcome; Understanding the Concepts of Medico Legal & Autopsy and Arms & Ammunition.

In pursuit of its commitment to judicial excellence and capacity building, the Punjab Judicial Academy (PJA), under the kind guidance of Hon'ble Chairperson, Board of Management, PJA successfully organized a specialized six-day training program titled: "Forensic Insight: Enhancing Judicial Outcomes – Understanding the Concepts of Medico-Legal & Autopsy and Arms & Ammunition." Covering the following key areas;

- Basic and advanced concepts in forensic science
- Medico-legal practices and interpretation of autopsy reports
- Collection, preservation, and analysis of forensic evidence
- Technical understanding of arms, ammunition, and ballistics

The primary object of the program was to equip the participants with essential theoretical understanding and practical skills in forensic science, medical jurisprudence, autopsy protocols, and arms and ammunition analysis — all of which are immensely vital for the effective adjudication of criminal cases. The Punjab Judicial Academy feeling the necessity to improve the knowledge of trial court judges, especially of those who are dealing criminal trials, invited very eminent and renowned resource persons from concerned departments / agencies as well as former Inspector General of Police to deliver lectures on the highly technical subjects which were generously appreciated by the participants/trainee judges. Each training batch comprised 18 comprehensive sessions. The training batch began with a Pre-Training Assessment Test to evaluate existing knowledge levels. This enabled facilitators to identify knowledge gaps and customize the content accordingly. In the current quarter, April to June 2025, five (05) batches were conducted, with a total of one hundred & forty four (144) Judicial Officers participating in these training sessions.

One Week Face to Face Training Course - 2025 on Mediation Skills With Reference to ADR under the Punjab Alternate Dispute Resolution Act 2019 (Additional District & Sessions Judges, Senior Civil Judges and Civil Judges-cum-Magistrates).

he ever-increasing pendency of cases in courts has posed significant challenges to the efficiency and effectiveness of the justice delivery system in Pakistan. In this context, Alternate Dispute Resolution (ADR) mechanisms, especially mediation, have emerged as vital tools for promoting timely, cost-effective, and amicable settlement of disputes. Recognizing the importance of ADR, the Government of Punjab enacted the Punjab Alternate Dispute Resolution Act, 2019, which institutionalizes mediation and other ADR techniques in civil and criminal matters. This legislative development necessitates a paradigm shift in how judicial officers view and facilitate dispute resolution — moving beyond adversarial litigation towards collaborative problem-solving.

In order to equip judicial officers with the necessary skills, understanding and confidence to effectively utilize and promote mediation and ADR process within the framework of the law, the Punjab Judicial Academy (PJA), under the kind directions of the Hon'ble Chief Justice Lahore High Court / Chairperson, Board of Management, PJA organized a One Week Face to Face Training Course - 2025 on Mediation Skills With Reference to ADR under the Punjab Alternate Dispute Resolution Act 2019 (Additional District & Sessions Judges, Senior Civil Judges and Civil Judges-cum-Magistrates).

This training is not only timely but essential for the following reasons:

- a) Legal Mandate: The Punjab ADR Act, 2019 mandates the courts to explore ADR options, particularly in civil, family, commercial, and compoundable criminal cases. Judicial officers must be well-versed in their statutory responsibilities under this law.
- b) Skill Development: Mediation requires a different skill set than adjudication. Judicial officers need structured training to adapt to this evolving role effectively.

- c) Judicial Efficiency: By resolving suitable disputes through mediation, courts can significantly reduce delays and enhance judicial productivity.
- d) Public Trust and Access to Justice: ADR processes are often quicker, less expensive, and more amicable than traditional trials, thus enhancing public confidence in the justice system.
- e) International Best Practices: Many jurisdictions globally have successfully integrated ADR into their judicial systems. Pakistan must align with these best practices to ensure modern, people-centric justice delivery.
- f) Institutional Responsibility: As custodians of justice, judicial officers play a pivotal role in fostering dispute resolution mechanisms that emphasize reconciliation, fairness, and equity over technicalities and confrontation.



Most absorbing lectures on the topic were delivered by renowned legal consultants. This one-week intensive training course provided a crucial platform to the judicial officers for enhancing their capabilities in this regard. Through interactive learning, role plays and legal analysis, participants have been better prepared to operationalize mediation as an integral part of their judicial functions — contributing significantly to judicial reforms and the broader goal of "Justice for All."

3 Months Pre-Service Training Program – 2025 for Newly Appointed Civil Judges-cum-Magistrates.

n the directions of the Hon'ble Chief Justice, Lahore High Court

/ Chairperson, Board of Management, Punjab Judicial Academy,
the PJA organized a comprehensive Three-Month Pre-Service
Training Program – 2024 for thirty-three newly appointed Civil
Judges-cum-Magistrates, commenced from 12th June, 2025. This training
program is meticulously designed to equip new judicial officers with the
essential knowledge, skills, and ethical grounds required for the fair and
effective dispensation of justice.

While preparing the modules and curriculum for the participants of Three-Month Pre-Service Training Program – 2024, this time under the vision of Hon'ble Chief Justice, Lahore High Court and upon directions of Hon'ble Director General, Punjab Judicial Academy, special emphasis has been given to build a strong and sound personality of the trainee judges, not only on moral and ethical side but on the legal and practical aspects of the judicial service. These special training modules would enhance the capacity of the young trainee judges to write different types of orders and judgments while holding a proper court after listening the arguments in the court rooms. This exercise would improve the confidence of trainee judges.

Objectives of the Pre-Service Training Program are:

- a) To inculcate judicial ethics, professionalism, and a strong sense of responsibility.
- b) To develop core judicial skills including trial conduct, evidence appreciation, and decision-making.
- c) To enhance the ability to write well-reasoned, logical, and clear judgments.
- d) To strengthen administrative and managerial capabilities necessary for court management.
- e) To familiarize participants with the use of IT tools and digital resources in the justice system.
- f) To provide in-depth understanding of substantive and procedural law, along with relevant precedents.

- g) To offer practical exposure to courtroom procedures through mock trials and court attachments.
- h) To introduce key concepts of forensic science and medical jurisprudence relevant to judicial work.
- *i)* To enable judges to critically analyze revenue records and assess their evidentiary value in judicial proceedings.

Stressing the critical role of judicial integrity and ethics, Her Ladyship remarked that the true strength of the judiciary lies in the personal character of its judges. She called for absolute integrity, impartiality, and moral courage to guide every judicial act. Highlighting the need for professional excellence, the Hon'ble Chief Justice advised the new judges to strive for in-depth legal understanding, clear and well-reasoned judgment writing, effective courtroom management, and familiarity with evolving legal fields, particularly those involving forensic and digital evidence. Her Ladyship also spoke about the judiciary's dependence on public trust, noting that legitimacy is earned through fair conduct, transparency, and unwavering dedication to justice. Finally, Her Ladyship reminded the inductees that judicial office is a position of service, not of power, and urged them to remain humble, empathetic, and accessible, particularly

underprivileged and marginalized segments of society while ensuring transparency and impartiality in administration of justice without favour or fear.



The Hon'ble Chief Justice also appreciated the Punjab Judicial Academy's tireless efforts in providing high-quality judicial training and encouraged the trainee judges to make full use of this unique opportunity for professional growth. Her Ladyship generously applauded and appreciated the role of Director General, Punjab Judicial Academy in making the PJA more effective and meaningful. he integration of Artificial Intelligence in the judicial regime marks a significant step towards modernization and efficiency in the justice system. The introduction to AI and its role in the judiciary is essential to familiarize judicial officers with the technological advancements shaping global legal practices. Generative AI-powered legal tools, in particular, present immense potential to enhance legal research, streamline case preparation, and assist in drafting precise, well-reasoned judgments. Practical demonstration exercises—covering general-purpose, legal-specific, and case-specific tools—are crucial to develop hands-on proficiency and confidence in their use. Civil and criminal case practice sessions enable participants to apply AI tools in realistic scenarios, bridging the gap between theory and practice.
