As noted above, Question No.10 from Part-C is compulsory, which shall be of 20 Marks only.

PROPOSITION

Q No. 10: The defendant agreed to sell his house in Rawalpindi which was in a ruinous, if not in a dangerous condition. Monsoon was just setting in. The defendant's object in selling the house was to avoid repairs that might be required to save the house in heavy rains. Therefore, on discussion at the time of contract, time for completion was fixed as 12 days only. The purchaser thereafter obtained a month's extension. Before the expiry of the extended period, the defendant gave to the plaintiff two notices, but the plaintiff took no action on the basis of agreement, and the defendant, after the extended date, made heavy repairs. Ahmed had a traveling agency and was associated with an international Air traveling agency which sanctioned all booking of airline tickets worldwide through them for Ahmed. Ahmed opened his account for the purpose of payment to IATA at bank B. Ahmed had never applied for any loan with the same bank. The International Air traveling Agency had an account in the same bank B. Ahmed used to pay his dues after every 15 days as a matter of policy on 13.5.2024 being the due date of payment Ahmed in consequences of remittance notice issued by the IATA submitted a payment of cheque worth Rs 2 million. Later on the same day due to torrential rains the electricity failure occurred. B the bank failed to process the cheque.

The very next date on 14.5.2024 IATA suspended the license of Ahmed through notice of default in payment and withheld all ticketing facilities of Ahmed's traveling agency.

Ahmed has suffered losses on account of immediate stoppage of business due to the Bank negligence and failure to process the cheque. Under the State Bank regulations every bank is bound to ensure emergency measures so that financial transactions are completed.
