Quranic Message

As part of this initiative, each training session at the Academy commences with the recitation of the Holy Quran, followed by an interactive session of Quranic principles of justice and Islamic Justice teachings, conducted by the Hon'ble Mr. Justice (R) Sadar Ahmed Naeem, the Director General PJA. The session focused on Quranic guidance and Hadith related to justice in society, family, and the judicial system, offering deep insights into the ethical obligations of the judiciary. The initiative underscores the Quran's comprehensive directives on justice and their relevance in contemporary legal proceedings. During this quarter, the concept of administration of

justice in the light of verses of Surah An-Nisa, Surah Al-Hadid, Surah Al-Muddassir and Surah Nuh was highlighted.



The integration of Quranic teachings into judicial training has received widespread recognition from participants, including judicial officers and legal practitioners, who have expressed their profound appreciation for the initiative. Many have acknowledged its significant impact on their professional approach to justice, as well as its influence on their personal understanding of fairness, integrity, and responsibility.

The Punjab Judicial Academy remains committed to enrich judicial education through a multidimensional approach, ensuring that Islamic principles, legal frameworks, and modern jurisprudence collectively contribute to the effective and just administration of law in Punjab.

Academic Activities

(October to December, 2024)

One Week Training Program-2024 for Judicial Officers (Additional District & Sessions Judges, Senior Civil Judges and Civil Judges) on Revenue Documents Analysis and Inheritance Issues.



The Punjab Judicial Academy is committed to enhance the capacity and professional competency of judicial officers and court personnel through various training programs. The analysis and admissibility of revenue documents is the main issue in every civil litigation. For dispensation of justice in civil cases, it is necessary for the judicial officers to learn about the revenue documents. Hon'ble Chairperson, Board of Management, PJA while realizing the problems and issues faced by the judges of district judiciary in analysing the revenue documents in civil litigation, directed the Academy to design a curriculum on this important issue. With the approval of Hon'ble Chief Justice Lahore High Court, Lahore/Chairperson, Board Management, PJA, the Academy has designed a one-week training program on "Revenue Documents Analysis and Inheritance Issues" for judicial officers to refresh legal knowledge and strengthen judicial understanding of revenue documents. This new Six Day training program focuses on judicial proceedings and improving self-learning and research capabilities. By enhancing these skills, the program aims to support effective judicial decision-making in inheritance and civil matters which are mostly based on revenue document analysis, thereby ensuring fair and efficient administration of justice in the district judiciary.

During the current quarter (October-December, 2024), four (04) batches on "Revenue Document Analysis and Inheritance Issues", were conducted. Each training batch comprised of Addl. District & Sessions Judges, Senior Civil Judges and Civil Judges. One hundred and Fiftyeight (158) participants received training in these sessions. The detail of the batches is provided in table form, given below:

The inaugural ceremony of each batch was presided over by the Hon'ble Director General, Punjab Judicial Academy, Mr. Justice (R) Sardar

Ahmed Naeem, former Judge Lahore High Court, Lahore. The inaugural ceremony of each batch commenced with the recitation of Holy Quran. In the inaugural ceremony, the Director General addressed the participants highlighting the key features of the training program aimed to enhance the skills of judicial officers in analysing revenue documents and inheritance issues, ensuring the quick resolution of civil cases. He further asserted that the training sessions are designed not only to improve the technical skills but also to boost their confidence in decision making. He also briefed the participants on the importance of observing the Code of Conduct. He also briefed the participants about Quranic message session and literary session (Naamwar) as part of their training sessions. The faculty of Punjab Judicial Academy including Advisor, Directors and Senior Instructors attended these inaugural ceremonies.

Following this, the Hon'ble Director General, Punjab Judicial Academy delivered Quranic message to the trainee judges, emphasizing upon the importance and standards of the administration of justice in the light of verses of the Holy Quran and Sunnah of the Holy Prophet (Peace & Blessings of ALLAH Be Upon Him). After the Qur'anic message, trainee judges attended the regular training sessions on "Revenue Document Analysis and Inheritance issues."

The Punjab Judicial Academy invited experts from the revenue department having experience in drafting and analysing revenue documents to impart training to the judges. Mr. Saleem Raza Gillani, Tehsildar (Rtd.) presently working in the Liquidation Board and Mr. Azmat Khan, Naib Tehsildar, presently working as an Instructor in the Revenue Academy shared their knowledge, expertise and experiences with participants to enhance their judicial understanding of revenue documents and to equip them with advanced skills in legal analysis of these documents and inheritance issues. They used modern techniques and IT tools to impart the knowledge to the trainees. The training sessions remained interactive. The participants took keen interest in the analysis of the revenue documents.









Upon successful completion of each training batch for Additional District & Sessions Judges, Senior Civil Judges and Civil Judges, the concluding ceremony of each training batch was chaired by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Sardar Ahmed Naeem, Director General, Punjab Judicial Academy. The ceremony started with the recitation of verses from the Holy Quran. Thereafter, a representative of trainee judges from each batch shared his/her views and feedback on behalf of their batchmates, appreciating the new training module of analysis of revenue documents and the efforts of the resource persons to inculcate practical knowledge of these documents in interactive sessions. They also appreciated the new segments of Quranic message and literary session, "NAAMWAR."



Hon'ble The Director General addressed the participants of each training batch, expressing confidence that the training had provided valuable insights that would enhance their ability to analyse revenue documents, leading to faster resolutions of civil cases related to these documents which ultimately strengthen the public trust in the judicial system. The concluding ceremony was also attended by Mr. Muhammad Hafeez Ullah Khan, Advisor to PJA, Ms.

One Week Training Program-2024 for Judicial Officers (Additional District & Sessions Judges, Senior Civil Judges and Civil Judges) on Forensic Science, Medical Jurisprudence, Arms & Ammunition.



With the approval of the Hon'ble Chief Justice Lahore High Court/ Chairperson, BoM of PJA, the Academy has designed Six Day Training Program for Judicial Officers (Additional District & Sessions Judges, Senior Civil Judges and Civil Judges-cum-Judicial Magistrates) on "Forensic Insight, Enhancing Judicial Outcome, Understanding the Concepts of Medico Legal & Autopsy, Arms & Ammunition". The program aims to equip the judicial officers with essential skills and knowledge of forensic science required for dispensation of justice in criminal cases.

The Six Day training program focuses on "Forensic Science, Medico-Legal Practices, Autopsies, and Arms & Ammunition Analysis". The objective of the program was to educate judges about the latest techniques and best practices in forensic analysis. This structured initiative was designed to enable the judicial officers to provide an insight and practical knowledge qua collection of forensic evidence from the crime scene and to equip them with skills to analyse the medical evidence produced in criminal trial.

During this quarter (October-December, 2024) four (04) batches of training program were conducted. One hundred & seventeen (117) judges participated in these training programs in different batches. The detail of these batches is provided below:

Inaugural Ceremony:

The training of each batch commenced with an inaugural ceremony, presided over by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Sardar Ahmed Naeem, Director General, PJA. The ceremonies began with the recitation from the Holy Quran. The Hon'ble Director General welcomed the participants and emphasized upon the importance of continuous learning in the judiciary. He asserted that the Academy designed the training program and curriculum keeping in view practical problems faced by judges in judicial proceedings. The training module has been prepared to keep the judges updated on recent developments in substantive and procedural laws. He highlighted that the current training program covers a range of topics, including forensic analysis, medico-legal practices, autopsy reports and arms & ammunition analysis which are essential for fair administration of justice in criminal cases.



The Hon'ble Director General further stressed that the program is structured to equip judges with the necessary knowledge and skills to handle cases involving forensic evidence effectively. "We believe that continuous learning is essential for judges to stay in touch with current and latest advancements in forensic science and medico-legal practices," the Hon'ble Director General reiterated. He also emphasized the importance of listening to litigants and fostering an environment that allows them to express themselves openly. He stated that judges should listen to litigants with patience and empathy and avoid discouraging them. This approach is important to ensure that justice is served fairly and transparently. He further added that experts from various fields have been invited to deliver lectures and lead discussions, providing participants with comprehensive training and hands-on experience.



After the inaugural ceremony, the trainee judges undergone through a Pre-Training Test. In the Six Day training program, trainee judges attended eighteen sessions. Academy invited experts from the relevant field to impart training to the judges. For practical analysis and examination of firearms and ballistics, the Academy arranged for production of these firearms and ballistics for demonstration during training sessions. The detail of these sessions is given below:

First session was conducted by Mr. Sarmad Saeed, Former I.G, Punjab Police, Lahore, on the topic, "Firearms & Ballistics, (Introduction to firearms Forensics, Types of Ballistics and Introduction to small arms)".

Second session was also conducted by Mr. Sarmad Saeed, Former I.G, Punjab Police, Lahore on the topic, "Propellants (Introduction to propellants, percussion caps, rifled barrel)".

Third session was conducted by Mr. Danish Aslam, FS (FTM), PFSA on the topic, "Firearms & Tool Marks Examination: (Introduction to firearms identification, cartridge cases and bullets analysis, automated ballistic identification system and its

role, GSR Analysis, Serial Number restoration, Tool marks examination, Report Wording)".

Fourth session was conducted by Mr. Sarmad Saeed, Former I.G, Punjab Police, Lahore on the topic, "Anatomy of Guns, (Caliber and bore, handguns, shotguns, Land and Grooves)"

Fifth session was conducted by Mr. Sarmad Saeed, Former I.G, Punjab Police, Lahore on the topic, "Guns Marks, (Firing pin impressions, extractor and ejector mark, breech marks, other tool marks, striation marks, Tool Mark Comparison)".

Sixth session was also conducted by Mr. Sarmad Saeed, Former I.G, Punjab Police, Lahore on the topic "Analysis of Firing, (Test Firing, Gunshot Residue, Comparison Microscope, automated comparison, Range of conclusion, Documenting Evidence)".

Seventh session was conducted by Dr. Arif Rasheed Mailk, HoD Forensic Medicine Rahber Medical College, Lahore on the topic, "Physical/ Sexual Assault, (Relevant Laws, Medico Legal System, Infrastructure of Medico Legal Clinic, Autopsy Lab, Format of Autopsy/Medico Legal Certificates etc.)."

Eighth session was conducted by Prof. Dr. Arif Rasheed Mailk, HoD, Forensic Medicine Rahber Medical College, Lahore on the topic, "Protocol of Medico Legal Examination, (Identification of Injuries, Determination of Nature of Injury, kind of Weapon, Duration and Comments on Possibility of Fabrication, Collection of evidence etc.)."

Ninth session was conducted by Mr. Abdul Rehman, FS (CSI) PFSA on the topic, "Crime Scene Investigation: Best Practices, (Basic of Crimes Scene Investigation, Importance of Forensic Evidence in Crime Scene Investigation)".

Tenth session was conducted by Mr. Qaiser Hussain, FS (DNA), PFSA on the topic, "Forensic DNA Analysis from collection to

court room (Introduction & Significance of DNA Analysis, challenges/Limitations, DNA Database and Cases solved by DNA Analysis, Report Writing, Judgement of Superior Courts regarding DNA Analysis).

Eleventh session on the topic, "Medico Legal Examination of Poisoning Cases" conducted by Prof. Dr. Nasreen Ihsan Ullah, HoD Forensic Medicine Sheikh Zayed Medical & Dental College, Lahore.

Twelfth session was conducted by Ms. Shahnaz Akhtar, FS (TC), PFSA on the topic, "Trace Chemistry (Introduction & Significance of trace evidence, types & identification of trace evidence, packing & preservation of trace evidence, Analysis of trace evidence, techniques & instruments, Report Format and wording)"

Thirteenth session was conducted by Mr. Muhammad Asim Jabbar, FS, PFSA on the topic, "Pathology (Introduction to Forensic Pathology, Forensic Pathology Specimen Procedures, Forensic Pathology sampling according to case types; Forensic Histopathology Techniques; Cross Questioning)".

Fourteenth session was conducted by Mr. Danish Javed, FS (NAR) PFSA on the topic, "Narcotics (Introduction to Narcotics Section, Scope of work as per Control of Narcotics Substance Act, 1997 (CNSA), Common cases received at Narcotics section, Discussion of new Amendments of CNSA & Govt. Analyst Rules, Report Format and Interpretation, Case Study)".

Fifteenth session was conducted by Mr. Muhammad Imran, Manager (TOX & NAR) PFSA, on the topic, "Forensic Toxicology, Analyzing substances of abuse (Introduction of Forensic Toxicology, Selection of Specimen, Anti-Mortem Specimen, Post-Mortem Specimen, Forensic Toxicology Analysis Form,

Qualitative vs Quantitative Reports, Interpretation of Toxicology Results)".

Sixteenth & Seventeenth sessions were conducted by Dr. Arif Rasheed Mailk, HoD Forensic Medicine Rahber Medical College, Lahore on the topic, "Protocol of Postmortem Examination, (Postmortem Report, Steps of Postmortem Examination, Framing of Opinion about Cause of Death) and Collection of Evidence for Toxicological (Histopathological & Serological Analysis, Determination of Time between Injury & Death, Death & Postmortem)".

Eighteenth session was conducted by Dr. Arif Rasheed Mailk, HoD Forensic Medicine Rahber Medical College, Lahore on the topic, "Postmortem Examination of Firearm Cases, Postmortem Examination of death due to asphyxia, burns RTA, Electrocution and Mechanical Injuries (Blunt, Sharp Weapons)".

On the direction and approval of the Hon'ble Chief Justice, Lahore High Court, Lahore/Chairperson, BoM, Punjab Judicial Academy organized Three Day training program from 28th to 30th October 2024 on "Implementation of an E-Procurement System". The training program aims to educate accounts & audit officers, staff of the Lahore High Court and District Judiciary across the Punjab about the E-Procurement system.



The training session began with registration of the participants. The ceremony was started with the recitation from the Holy Quran. The Hon'ble Director General, Mr. Justice (R) Sardar Ahmed Naeem, inaugurated the training program and welcomed the participants. The Hon'ble Director General emphasized the importance of continuous learning in the audit and accounts

especially with the new system of E-Procurement.

On the first day of training, the Managing Director of the Punjab Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA) delivered an insightful lecture to the participants, titled "Legal Framework and E-PAK Acquisition and Disposal Overview", emphasizing various aspects and advantages of adopting the e-procurement system. The new system is expected to streamline public procurement processes, promoting efficiency and transparency.

On the second & third day Mr. Raees Abbasi, Mr. Rizwan and Mr. Hammad delivered the lecture to the participants covering the various topics including;

- How supplier module work and how supplier get registered on e-procurement.
- Role Creation
- User Creation
- Procurement plan creation and how to add procurement activities to the same.
- Request for Quotation (Petty/RFQ)
- Process and its processing through supplier and procuring agencies (PAs)
- How to process E-submission of tender by (by uploading documents).
- How supplier respond/submit their bids.

The experts conducted practical workshops to provide hands-on experience to participants. The E-procurement system is seen as a transformative step, aligning with the government's vision of transparency and accountability in procurement procedures. It is designed to eliminate corruption, ensuring that procurement processes are fair, transparent, and efficient. This initiative is part of a broader strategy to enhance governance standards across public institutions, furthering the province's commitment to integrity and efficiency in public services.



















Three Month Pre-Service Training Program-2024 for Newly Appointed Additional District & Sessions Judges and Civil Judges-cum-Magistrates.



On the direction and instruction of the Hon'ble Chief Justice, Lahore High Court/Chairperson, BoM, PJA, the Academy organized a comprehensive **Three-Month Pre-Service Training Program-2024** for newly appointed two Additional District & Sessions Judges and six Civil Judges-cum-Magistrates, which commenced on **2**nd **December, 2024.** The program was designed to provide the essential knowledge & skills to newly appointed judges, ensuring that they gain the expertise required for fair dispensation of justice.

The objectives of the three months Pre-service training program are as follows:

- a) To develop judicial skills, ethics and professionalism.
- b) To equip judges with trial procedures and problem-solving skills.
- c) To enhance capacity for logical judgment writing.
- d) To develop administrative and managerial competencies.
- e) To familiarize judges with IT tools in justice system.
- f) To explain law fundamentals, procedures and precedents.
- g) To provide practical knowledge of the court system through attachments and mock trials.
- h) To update judges on forensic and medical jurisprudence concepts.
- i) To equip judges to evaluate revenue documents and assess their evidentiary value.



The Punjab Judicial Academy invited Hon'ble Judges of Constitutional Courts, District & Sessions Judges, motivational speakers, and associate professors from esteemed institutions including Punjab University, LUMS, University of Education, P.U. Law College and Kinnaird College as resource persons. 

2nd International Conference on "The Role of AI in Access to Justice in Pakistan" at Bahauddin Zakariya University, Gillani Law College, Multan



With the approval of Hon'ble Chief Justice Lahore High Court, Lahore and Chairperson, BoM, PJA, Mr. Justice (R) Sardar Ahmad Naeem, Director General, PJA as Guest of Honor attended the 2nd International Conference conducted at Bahauddin Zakariya University, Gillani Law College, Multan on the topic, "The Role of AI in Access to Justice in Pakistan," on December 10 & 11, 2024.

This landmark conference aimed to explore the intersection of artificial intelligence and law, highlighting how AI can revolutionize Pakistan's legal system, enhance accessibility, and ensure justice for all. This event brought together esteemed international and national legal scholars, practitioners, and students to discuss innovative solutions and critical issues related to AI and justice.



The conference provided an opportunity to examine the challenges and opportunities arising from the integration of artificial intelligence into Pakistan's legal framework. Discussions focused on AI's influence on the judicial system, considering cultural, ethical, and regulatory aspects. The event emphasized AI's potential to streamline legal procedures, promote innovation, and address the unique legal challenges faced by Pakistan in an era of technological advancement.

The participation of Hon'ble Mr. Justice (R) Sardar Ahmad Naeem in the conference underscored the Punjab Judicial Academy's commitment to modernizing judicial education and embracing technological advancements in the legal field. His lordship's presence as the Guest of Honor reinforced the significance of AI in shaping the future of judicial education in Punjab.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice (R) Sardar Ahmad Naeem, Director General, PJA in his address underscored the importance of AI in justice system and the issued involved in the application of AI in judicial system of Pakistan. His lordship emphasized that artificial Intelligence is of two words, one is "artificial" and second is "Intelligence", artificial means man made and intelligence means the capacity of thinking, so we can define the artificial intelligence as the branch of computer science by which we can develop intelligence machine which can behave like human, think like human and even make decision as per the logic program in memory.



His lordship stressed that artificial Intelligence is branch of science which deals with modifying machines for finding solutions of complex problems in human like fashion. AI is a machine in which we program the machine to work like a human, for example driving cars etc. In 2001, GPS introduced for personal vehicle for car navigation devices and now-a-days, vehicles are equipped with sensors.

He further stated that access to justice is the ability of people to seek and obtain justice while delivery of justice is the process of protecting the rights of everyone in a society. In the absence of Access to Justice people are unable to have their voices heard, exercise their rights. One of the major obstacle in accessing justice is the cost of legal advice and representation.

He further asserted that life presents every person with challenges. In our society the law matters, and yet for many people justice is elusive. In our country we promise equal justice under the law. But for many who are caught up in these and similar scenarios, the promise of equal justice is unfulfilled.

His lordship stated that access to Justice helps to preserve human dignity. Emblazoned on the façade of US Supreme Court building a four simple words intended to embody the overriding principle of the US legal system i.e. equal justice under law. Yet after more than 225 years, the nation still has not developed the means to fulfil this principle.

His lordship highlighted that access to justice crises is bigger than law and lawyers. It is a crisis of exclusion and inequality. Justice for only those who can afford it, is neither justice for all nor justice at all. (Nathan L. Hecht). He stated that the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, adopted by the United Nation's General Assembly on December 10, 1948 (The Declaration) includes several articles that highlight the importance to justice. He underscored the issues to access justice in his address. He stressed that the barriers to assess the justice may include:

- Legal fee and court costs that can be unaffordable for many people
- Lack of understanding about legal rights and how to seek legal enforcement
- Geographic barriers including limited access to information and legal services in rural and remote areas
- Difficulties in understanding and using the legal system
- Unfamiliar and complex legal processes
- Biases, including hidden one, that unfairly effect disadvantaged community of people with disabilities and other

While discussing these barriers, his lordship provided the solution by offering free or low-cost legal help, community education, efforts to simplify legal procedure and use of plain language, language translation services and technological solutions like online resources, virtual court hearings, and self-help tools that make the court more accessible. He emphasized that these are the steps that can help to improve access to justice.

His lordship showed his concern that intelligence machines now increasingly shape our society and people routinely rely on algorithm to perform tasks, often with greater precision and reliability than humans. Recently development in machine learning and natural language processing mean that machines are developing the capacity to approach novel problems autonomously and reason their way to independent outcomes.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice (R) Sardar Ahmad Naeem, asserted that new frontier of automation will see AI (Artificial Intelligence) deployed in complex activities that have until now been regarded as exclusive domain of the human mind. Against this backdrop, the law – like most fields – is rapidly being confronted with fundamental questions: (1) To what extent should machine augment and even replace humans? Put in another way, can a machine provide better, quicker and more just legal outcomes than a human?

His lordship stated that generally, there are two ways in which AI can provide legal service at a significantly reduced unit cost to a much larger portion of the population. Firstly, it can support the provision of legal services, and secondly, it can replace the role of legal experts. He stressed that many courts have also embraced replacement technologies, which are dramatically transforming the way in which disputes are handled. It is now common place to find examples of effling, video conferencing and entire e-courts in jurisdictions around the world. However, the advancement that chiefly impact the overall productivity of the justice system does not address the underlying complexity of the law. It is here that recent developments in AI can have the most impact. If the legal reasoning process is capable of automation, 'Access to Justice' would no longer be in the hands of the profession which has pecuniary interest in maintaining the monopoly over legal services.

He also asserted that a legal landscape that embraces intelligent machines has the potential to provide a more responsive and more accessible justice system than ever before but there are clearly theoretical and practical questions that remain unresolved and such questions have profound implications and they warrant serious and immediate attention from the concerned.

The address of the Hon'ble Mr. Justice (R) Sardar Ahmad Naeem, opened a new horizon for the think tank and it was widely discussed in the conference. The address of his lordship was highly applauded by the audience. The insights and discussions from the conference are expected to contribute to policy development, judicial training, and the implementation of AI-driven legal solutions in Pakistan.



famous in in Pakistan and India. He has received the prestigious Pride of Performance Award for his work. He also served as Assistant Professor at the Government College, Lahore.















Mr. Hussain Majrooh

The Punjab Judicial Academy has recently introduced a comprehensive Internship Policy aimed at providing law graduates and students with valuable hands-on experience in the legal field. This internship program offers aspiring law students a unique opportunity to gain practical insights into the workings of the Academy, helping bridge the gap between academic knowledge and real-world legal applications. Interns will have the chance to work in various departments of the Academy, deepening their understanding of legal procedures, research, and the broader judicial system.

The program is designed to cultivate a sense of professionalism, ethical conduct, and responsibility thus fostering critical thinking, problem-solving, and decision-making skills. The internship is open to law graduates and students in their final years of law programs, making it accessible to individuals who have already developed a foundational knowledge of legal concepts. One of the key aspects of the program is its duration, which spans over **12**

weeks (three months), ensuring that interns receive a thorough and immersive experience.

The Academy has divided the internship openings into two distinct periods in a year to accommodate the academic schedules of the interns. The summer session runs from July to September, with application submissions open from May 1st to May 31st each year. The winter session takes place from October to December, with applications accepted from August 1st to August 31st each year. These clearly defined periods of internship allow potential interns to plan and apply in advance, ensuring that they can align the internship with their academic commitments.

Interns will have the option to choose a specific department according to their area of interest. The departments included are Academic, Research, IT, and the Library. This tailored approach allows interns to focus on areas that align with their career aspirations, ensuring a more meaningful and impactful learning experience. Interns will work during two daily time slots, either from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. or 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., depending on their availability and department needs.

The Punjab Judicial Academy's newly introduced Internship Program has seen strong interest, with **five selected participants** joining for the first term after the review and interview process. The program began in **October 2024**, and candidates were chosen based on their academic qualifications, interviews, and alignment with the program's goals. The selected interns are:
